From the Rector

THE REV. ROB HARRIS

A voice cries out: "In the wilderness prepare the way of the LORD, make straight in the desert a highway for our God." -Isaiah 40:3

You may be familiar with this passage from Isaiah which we hear every Advent. We associate the words with John the Baptist because the gospel writer Mark casts John as the voice who cries from the wilderness reminding us to prepare a way for the LORD.

We are to make a highway in a desert. What does that mean?

One interpretation would be to fly to the Sahara or the Mojave or another desert and build a road there. But before packing your bags there may be another way to think of this, a way that involves no travel.

Close your eyes and imagine walking through a desert. Your feet sink with every step, and sand fills your shoes. You are a dirty, sweaty mess by the time you arrive at your destination.

Now imagine walking on a cement road across a desert. It is much easier to walk on solid ground, and your feet are cleaner as well. You reach your destination quicker and with less strain.

During Advent, perhaps the best way to prepare oneself is to think about where you can construct a highway in your life. Then build it. Maybe building a highway means cleaning that closet you used to hide clutter when you don't want to tidy the house. Maybe it means mending a broken friendship. Maybe it means volunteering. Whatever it means for you, start to build your highway with joy because you are preparing for the birth of the LORD.

Outreach Spotlight

"Veterans' Financial Assistance Program" will provide assistance to eligible Veterans, Veterans Dependents and Surviving Spouses. Eligible Veterans are those that have an honorable, general under honorable conditions and uncharacterized discharge status. Through the program, Silver Sage will assist beneficiaries with short-term and

temporary financial Emergency Services to include: one-time utility payments (may include electric, gas, propane, water, sewer, trash, late fees), one-time rental/mortgage payment (may include rent, mortgage, late fees, application fees, security deposits), and transportation services (may include bus passes, city and county transit passes, council of government transit service passes, taxis, and ride shares (Uber)). Silver Sage will not require beneficiaries to meet a poverty or other income level as a requirement for eligibility. Financial need will be determined by the veteran being behind on rent or mortgage (s) and/or utilities.

The Service Areas are: Bandera, Kendall, Kerr, Medina, Real, Uvalde.
